REFORM, RELIEF,

KEY CONCEPT

Some New Deal programs offered food and money outright to suffering people, others provided them with jobs and a steady income, while still others sought to prevent the conditions of the Depression from ever happening again. Most of these programs tried to address the Depression on three levels—relief, recovery, and reform. Some programs attacked the Depression on two or more of these levels at the same time.
