- The U.S. fought in Vietnam for about eight years and in World War II for only four. Why do you think casualties in World War II were significantly higher than those in Vietnam? How did these two wars differ?
- **3** How might you explain the shift in the ratio of dead to wounded in America's wars as the nation entered the 20th century?
- The totals given for some of the earliest wars on the graph are historians' best estimates. Why might records of the dead and wounded in the Revolutionary War and Civil War be incomplete? What were conditions like during these conflicts?
- Limb amputations and crippling leg wounds were three times as common among American soldiers in Vietnam compared with those fighting in Afghanistan today. Why do you think this is the case? What challenges do you think these vets have faced upon returning home?
